Forklift License Vaughan - Getting a forklift certification or forklift license in North America would require the trainee to do hands-on training in addition to classroom instruction. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the certification, training and licensing for powered industrial truck operators. Operators can get a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks that come with various options, like for example stand-up and sit-down. There are various types and sizes of forklift suitable for various industrial applications. Operator training courses are normally individualized to address the certain types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift inside a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift in a shipyard. The various forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and industries. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to focus on detailed program requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training programs.

On the job training which is provided by the employer is the most common form of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to offer classroom sessions and practical training on equipment at their place of work. Employers may opt to train workers on each and every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The curriculum incorporates forklift operation procedures, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company rules. Subject matters particular to the worksite, such as dangerous conditions or materials, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally requires an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training allows the operator to run a lift truck for that particular employer only.

The most important aspect of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one type of machine to another. Safety issues differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in offshore and marine uses.
