Telehandler Training Courses Vaughan - Employers are responsible for ensuring that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work proficiently utilizing telehandler machinery. The competence level of workers have to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers have to provide training so that employees attain the needed level of ability. The level of responsibility of the person should be taken into account when training is offered. Effective training would solve whatever deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training may be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

State/Provincial, local and federal regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not deal with such subject matters as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of people, using other attachments, or the use of rotating machinery. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Maintenance and Inspection

The telehandler requires routine maintenance similar to any other equipment. The machine would wear out over time, so correct maintenance is required to ensure the safe use of the telehandler equipment. Checks and inspections are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training to be able to monitor, prevent and rectify problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Employees require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be viewed seriously and followed, taking into account such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use checks are usually done by the user, while general maintenance is normally done by the telehandler owner.
